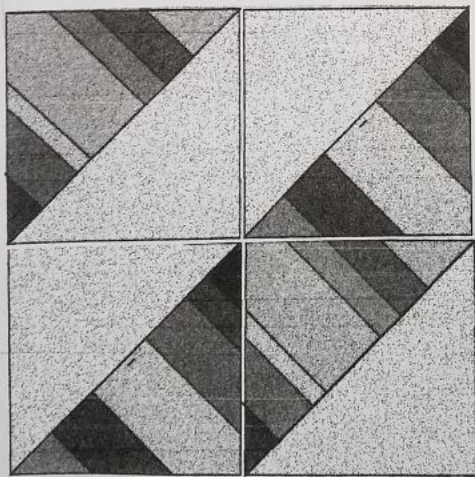
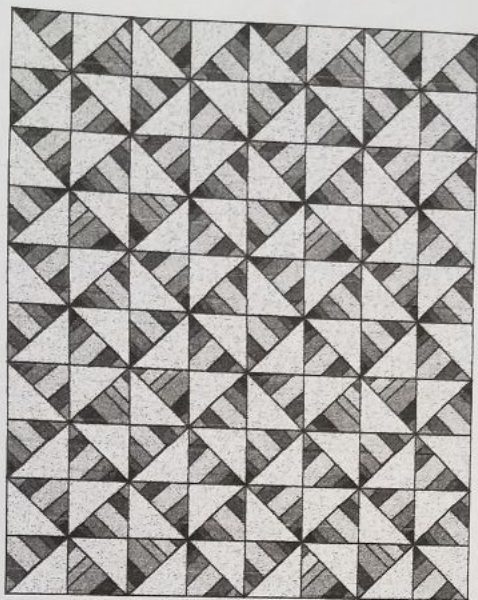


SCRAPPY HALF SQUARE TRIANGLE QUILT – **STRAIGHT FURROWS**

This is a very simple layout. All you need are 4 blocks sewn together as in the layout below. Make 20 of these units. Four of these units make one row. Five rows make the quilt.

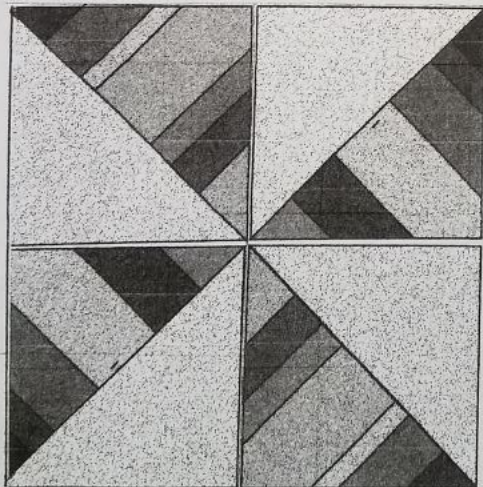

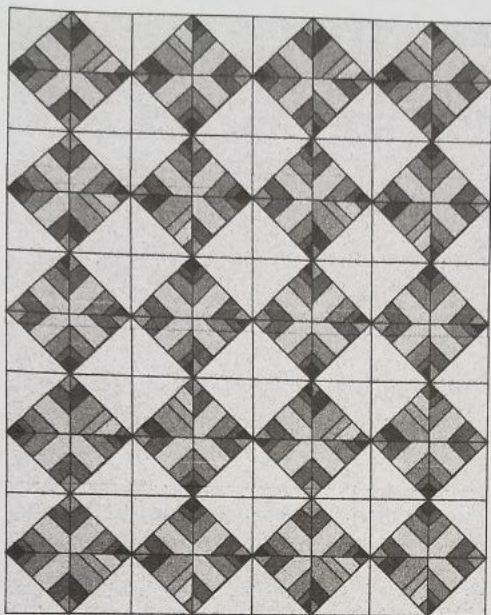


SCRAPPY HALF SQUARE TRIANGLE QUILT – PINWHEEL

This is a very simple layout. All you need are 4 blocks sewn together as in the layout below. Make 20 of these units. Four of these units make one row. Five rows make the quilt.

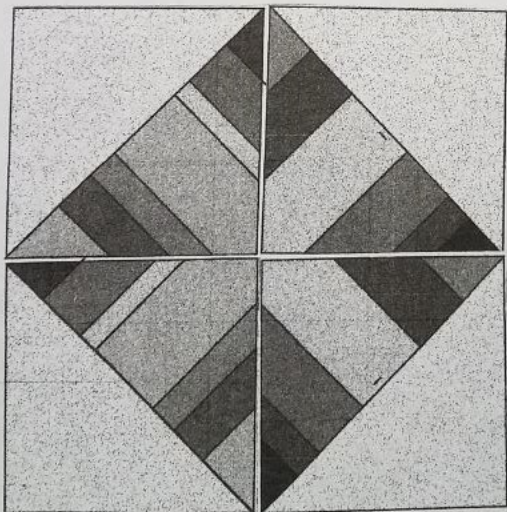


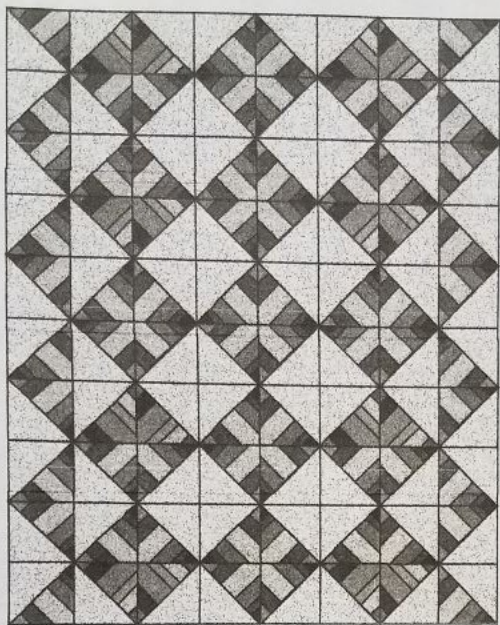

This is a very simple layout. All you need are 4 blocks sewn together as in the layout below. Make 20 of these units. Four of these units make one row. Five rows make the quilt.

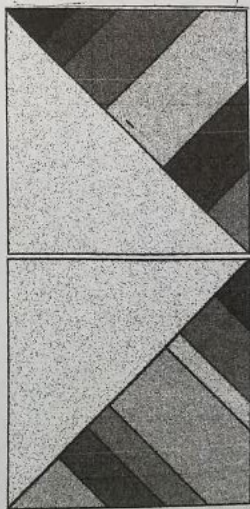
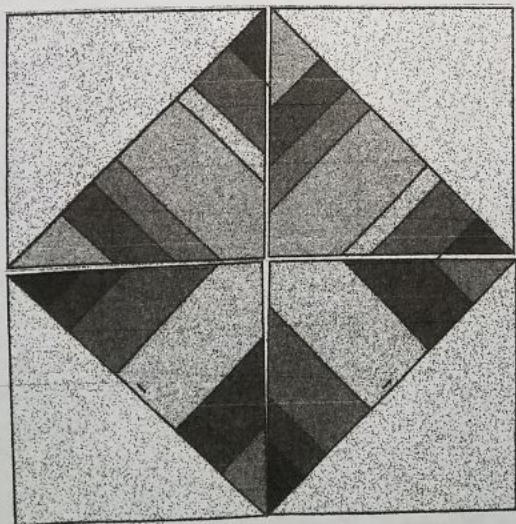


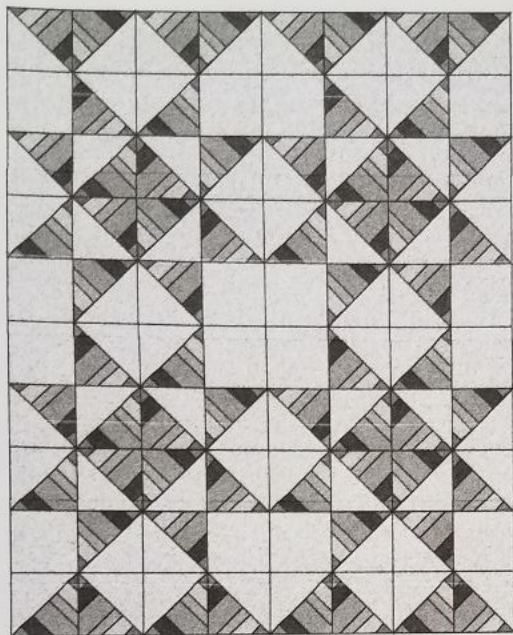


SCRAPPY HALF SQUARE TRIANGLE QUILT – 15 SQUARES & BORDERS

Make 15 units from 4 blocks as shown below to make the square blocks. Make 10 units from 2 blocks as shown below to make the side "borders".

Arrange 5 units to form 1 row. Five rows make the quilt.





SCRAPPY HALF SQUARE TRIANGLE QUILT OHIO STAR WITH BLANK CORNERS

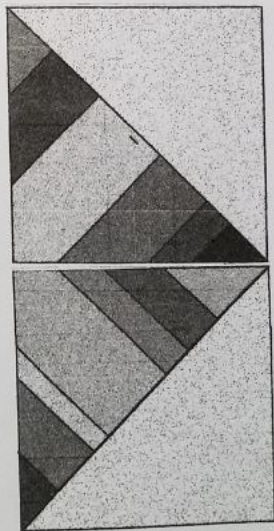
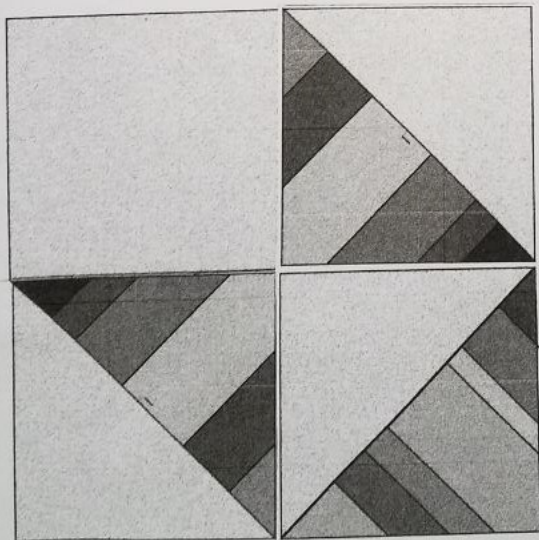
Background fabric

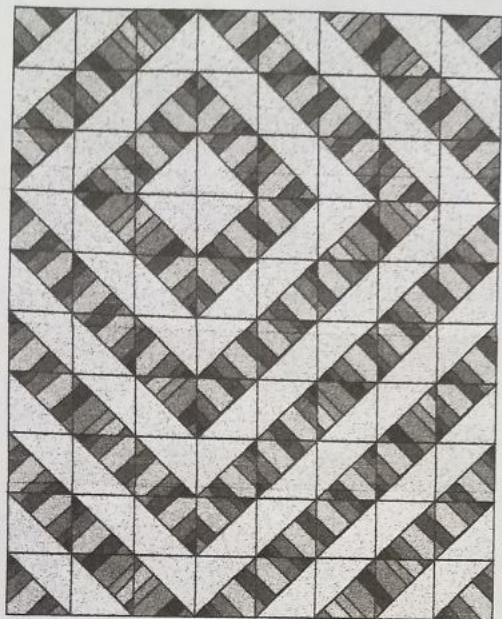
Cut 3 strips @ 7 1/4". Cut a TOTAL of 16 squares.

Cut 8 strips @ 6". Follow general directions to make 64 half square triangle Blocks.

Make 16 units from 4 blocks as shown below. Four of these units make 1 Ohio Star.

Make 8 units from 2 blocks as shown Below to make the 2 border rows.





SCRAPPY HALF SQUARE TRIANGLE QUILT – AROUND THE WORLD

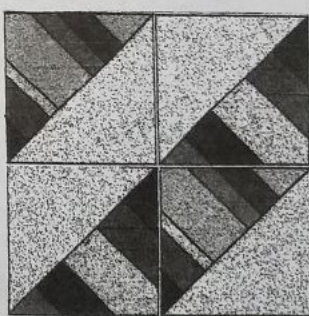
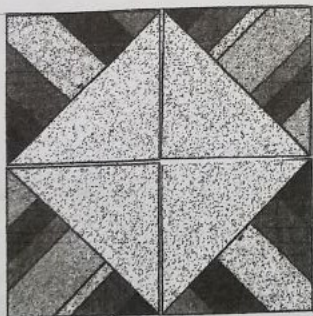
This quilt is made from 3 units of
4 squares each.

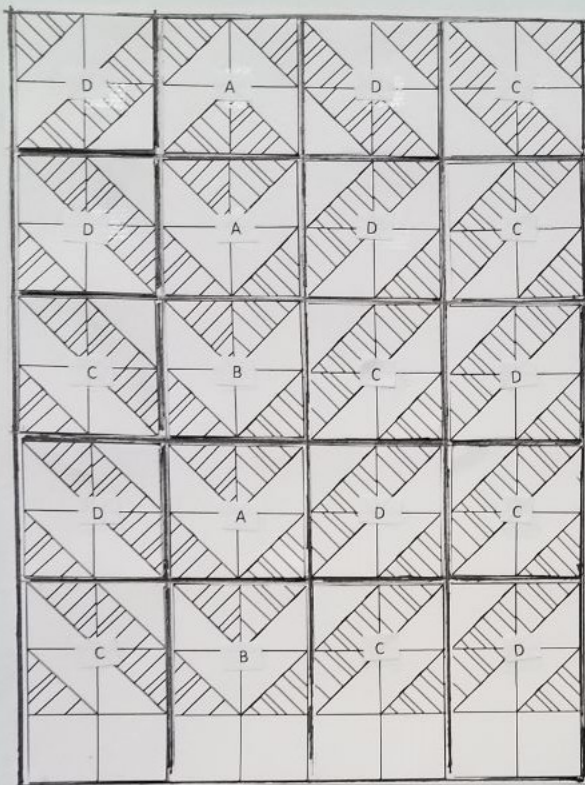
Make 1 of the left unit.

Make 7 of the center unit.

Make 12 of the right unit.

Follow the layout for each row.
Four units make 1 row, 5 rows
make the quilt.



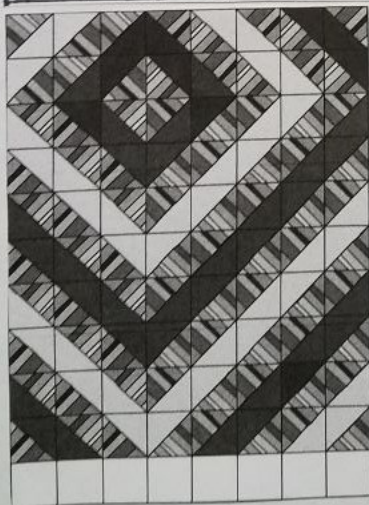


SCRAPPY HALF SQUARE TRIANGLE QUILT - TWO COLOR AROUND THE WORLD

Using two different background fabrics gives this quilt an entirely different look.

The quilt is made up of 4 squares arranged as follows. Place these units according to the diagram on the left. The quilt is made up of 4 columns. I recommend you construct the 2nd column first as it is easy then to see how the other units fall into place.

You will need 41 dark blocks and 39 light blocks. If you would like to add row 11 to make the quilt closer to 80", add the appropriate blocks to continue the design.

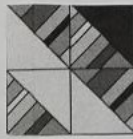

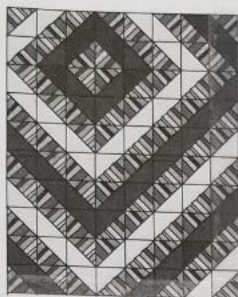

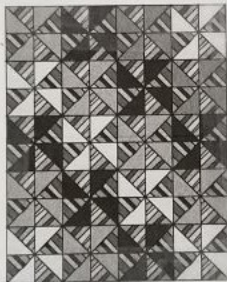
HOW COLOR AFFECTS THE FINAL LOOK OF YOUR QUILT



These illustrations are to show you how color can change the total look of your quilt. As previously suggested, you can arrange your strips to be all light, all dark, a random mix of light, medium and dark, and even predominately different colors. You can also use different background colors to achieve different looks.

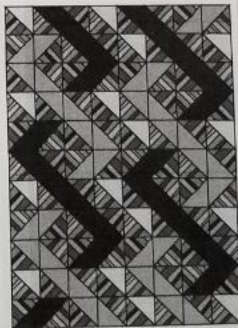
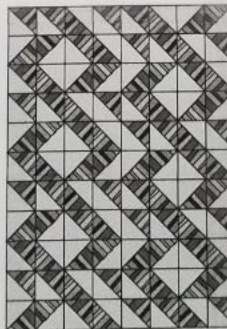
Since it is easiest for me to change the BACKGROUND shade of light to dark, you can imagine the background triangles to be your strips of light or dark, or to be different background colors

In the **Around The World** design, your rows could be light and dark or the background of your school's two colors. The **Pinwheel** pattern could alternate light strips with dark strips, or two different background colors, or three different backgrounds. The **Zig Zag** pattern shows the difference between a light background and a dark background. The third diagram shows three colors which could be background fabrics or reverse the triangles and imagine it in dark, light/medium and totally light strips.



To make a larger quilt from any of these designs, simply add more rows. Some of these designs will adapt more easily than others. I encourage you to play and have fun!

Please note that all of these designs are adaptable to half square triangles of any size. You can make them exactly the same way as these triangles are made – two different fabrics sewn together on both long edges and cut with a triangle ruler. Or use any other method for making half square triangles that you choose.
