

Hand Appliqué with Paper and Fabric Workshop

Give new life to magazine clippings and combine them with fabric to make beautiful and unique fiber art. First, we will design your block using paper and hand-dyed fabrics. Then you will cut, fuse, and hand-stitch the pieces in place. This is a great opportunity to learn how to stitch on paper. There will be also a demonstration on how to laminate and foil the magazine clippings.



Kit required: \$35.00

Includes:

- 8.5" by 11" laminated papers
- set of fabrics: silkscreened and hand-dyed fabrics
- one Aurifil®LANA thread
- light mixed media sheet

-prepared interfacing

-foil and glue tape

Student should bring:

- One paper back double-sided fusible web 8.5 by 11" (WonderUnder #805 by Pellon or Light Steam a seam2 or flexi fuse)
- One WonderUnder paper backed fusible web 8.5" by 11" #805 by Pellon or flexi fuse fusible web for laminating
- 10" embroidery hoop
- Marking pen for light colored and dark fabric
- Colorful embroidery threads
- Short sashiko needles (my preference) or embroidery needles 3-9 sizes
- Needle threader
- Fabric and paper scissors
- 6 pages of any recycled magazine* read box *
- Basic sewing supplies you like to use for handwork
- 2 pieces of 16" by 16" parchment paper

- Pencil
- Small ruler

What Printed Materials to Choose

What works: magazine clippings (light background; thin pages such as: people magazine, cooking, etc) ; Book pages (thin orphan pages) ; Musical sheets ***try to find different fonts if possible***

What doesn't work: Magazine covers ; Sales receipts ; Newspapers
