


Patriotic Pinwheels


Dragonfly Chain







Fused applique' with commercial fabrics; longarm machine guilted by my husband Rick. This quilt has been a long time coming to completion. After a number of obstacles were overcome, the applique' edges were stitched down but I was stuck how to finish it so it hung on the design wall. Rick liked it much more than I did and offered to finish it. He added tree trunks in heavy thread, branches of the shrubs with variegated thread, and quilting around the applique' shapes and over the sky and river.
