### Magic Star



### Linda Potorek

These two quilts (this slide and next) are quilt as you go. (As I sewed the strips onto the backing and batting, the block was also being quilted.)

I had oodles of strips of fabric that were between 1 and 3 inches wide. I pulled fabric that went together, and began the process. I began with an 11 inch square of backing fabric right side down and placed an 11 inch square of batting on top. I then placed a strip diagonally, corner to corner, right side up. The next strip placed right side down, and sewed with 1/4 inch seam. I folded the recent strip open, and continued the process. The block was trimmed to 10 inches, and then assembled with sashing both vertically and horizontally.


Linda is new to the guild, and she has three more that haven't been photographed due to rainy days.

It was during the spring that my eye saw the yellow and purple flower print in my collection of fabric. As I pulled coordinating fabric, various patterns came to my mind.

I decided to experiment with the flowered fabric, and insert 2 inch strips of fabric.

I did quilt this on my domestic machine, and used various embroidery stitches as I quilted.




## Sonja Hagen




