



Intentionally Pieced Large Scale Workshop (using Wings pattern) with Amy Friend of www.duringquiettime.com

Wings is a bold, modern and dynamic design. This class is perfect for those who have a basic knowledge of paper piecing and want to work intentional fabric placement while piecing on a relatively large foundation. Beginners shouldn't shy away from this class either. I will demo several times for those new to FPP. Paper piecing fabric placement tricks will be shared.

Supplies required for Wings Quilt workshop:

The Wings Pattern by Amy Friend is a requirement. Each participant should purchase their own copy. It can be purchased as a PDF download with full size foundations from my [website](#) or my [Etsy Shop](#).

Sewing machine

Size 90 sewing machine needle

Thread—50 weight is ideal

Cutting mat

Rotary cutter

Seam ripper

Ruler

Fabric:

The pattern includes the fabric requirements for the entire quilt. During the workshop, your skill and experience level will determine how much you accomplish. If you tend to move quickly, I would pull enough fabrics to complete a row.

This pattern is a great one for larger scraps. Choose a color palette and see what you have in your stash! I ask that you ***please include a number of directional prints, and at least one stripe as this workshop will focus on the intentional placement of directional prints on your foundation.***

There is no need to come with any fabrics precut. My personal preference is to cut only enough for one block, especially when it comes to paper piecing. Everyone's comfort level with the size fabric they are using to cover a particular area varies so I think it is best to try it out first. Also, I am going to share some tips for avoiding fabric waste. There are cutting directions for the background fabric on page 3 of the pattern in case you are very eager to accomplish lots at the workshop and want a head start. You could have those precut.

Foundations:

Print 8 each of Block A and Block B foundations, found in the PDF pattern, for the workshop on copy paper or your favorite paper for foundation paper piecing.
